Contrary to that popular lore, our ethical guidelines are really our professional best friends. Bringing clarity about boundaries, highlighting potentially problematic areas, and giving voice to what best practices look like, our standards stand beside us as we navigate the complicated world of rendering assistance to people with emotional/mental health challenges. Ultimately, our licensing board and professional association ethical standards are our stalwart companion on the road to delivering effective service.

Upon completion of the workshop, participants will:

- Be familiar with the current Ethical Standards of the American Counseling Association.
- Be able to identify common areas of ethical challenge in their own practice setting.
- Be aware of their own personal style and the ethical challenges that style creates.
- Identify current trends in the evolution of ethical standards in the counseling profession.
- Be familiar with the community nature of ethical definitions.
